I have long standing experience in intervening and supporting the adoption process.

For the past two years, I have had the privilege of serving as an IPSO representative for the Training Institute of the Italian Psychoanalytic Society (SPI) in Rome. This role has allowed me to immerse myself in IPSO's vibrant community, and through it, I have been fortunate enough to witness the depth of commitment and passion that drives our collective professional growth.
